GENERAL RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. All exhibits to be staged no later than 9.30am on the day of the show, and must be the property of and grown by the exhibitor's own garden, decorative classes exempted.
2. Exhibits must be arranged and then finally be placed in position as directed by the stewards.
3. No exhibit to be entered in more than one class.
4. The committee will take reasonable care of exhibits in their possession but will not be responsible for any damage.
5. The judges are empowered to withhold prizes for any entry not considered of sufficient merit, and in all classes their decision will be FINAL.
6. The Inverell District Floral Art Association will provide bottles for displaying exhibits, but where containers are specified, they must be used and supplied by the exhibitors.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS FOR CUT FLOWERS

A vase is taller than it is wide.

A bowl is wider than it is high.

A container can either be a vase or a bowl.

HINTS FOR SHOWING CUT FLOWERS

A rose, if possible, have a long stem with healthy foliage, with no side buds, and should look at the judge when displayed in the container.

A rose in full bloom must show stamens.

Rose of any colour, is a colour not specified in the schedule, e.g. mauve, apricot etc.

Rose in four stages, i.e. Bud to Full Bloom, Bud should show very little colour, next rose one quarter open and then three quarters open and then full bloom showing stamens.

4. One Rose of any colour, variety
5. One Miniature Rose of any colour, variety
6. Bunch of Roses, mixed colour and variety, 10 cut

SECTION 2 - DAHLIAS

7. One Open Large Decorative Dahlia
8. One Open Medium Decorative Dahlia
9. One Open Miniature Decorative Dahlia
10. One Cactus Dahlia, any colour and size
11. One Pom-Pom Dahlia any colour and size
12. One Dahlia of any type
13. Three same type Dahlias of any type

SECTION 3 - MISC. CUT BLOOMS

14. One Geranium
 15. Three Zinnias
 16. Three Marigolds
 17. One single cut of all other variety of flowers
- Champion Misc. Bloom of Show***

SECTION 4 - NATIVES

18. One cut Grevilia
 19. One cut Callistemon (Bottlebrush)
 20. Bunch of Native Flowers, mixed 10 cut minimum
- Champion Native of Show***

SECTION 5 – POTS and CONTAINERS

21. Single Cacti/Succulent
 22. Indoor Pot
 23. Outdoor Pot
 24. Potted Flowering Plant
 25. Miniature Garden Cacti/ succulent mixed (minimum of four types in one pot)
- Champion Potted or Container of Show***

SECTION 6- BUNCH OF FLOWERS with FOLIAGE

26. One bunch of mixed flowers with foliage (minimum 10 cuts)
 27. One bunch of flowers in a novelty vase e.g. Teapot, jug, be creative. Four cuts
- Champion Bunch of Flowers with Foliage***

SECTION 7 – FAKE IT TILL YOU MAKE IT

28. Christmas Centre Piece
29. Arrangement of Fake Flowers
30. Display of Everything Natural at least three different types e.g. bones, bark, sticks
31. LEGO Six different Flower types and vase all made of Lego
